Medi-Cal Program Changes: 2025-26 State Budget Impacts



Current as of October 24, 2025



The 2025-26 California state budget designates \$307 billion for health and human services programs. The final budget, which was passed by the state legislature and signed by the governor, will implement changes to the Medi-Cal program between 2025 and 2027, as outlined below.

July		Reduction in Clinic Payments	FQHCs and RHCs that provide state-only funded services to individuals with UIS would receive reimbursement at the applicable Medi-Cal FFS rate and Medi-Cal managed care rate.
	(F)	Dental Benefits	Elimination of dental benefits for individuals with UIS, aged 19 years and older.
		Supplemental Payments	Eliminates \$362 million for dental supplemental payments.
