### WHAT IS OHCA?

The Office of Health Care Affordability (OHCA) is charged with analyzing health care cost drivers and trends, and developing data-informed policies to lower health care costs. OHCA sits under the Department of Health Care Access and Information.



#### **OHCA STRUCTURE**



OHCA has a **Health Care Affordability Board** whose primary responsibility is
to **set annual spending targets** for
maximum annual growth in health care
spending for certain entities.



OHCA also has a **Health Care Affordability Advisory Committee** that provides technical input, data analysis, and recommendations to the Board, but has no decision-making authority.

#### **DATA & ENFORCEMENT**

Total health care expenditures data must be submitted each year by health care entities annually for the previous two calendar years.



Beginning in 2026, if a health care entity exceeds the growth cap for the year, OHCA may take actions including:



- Technical assistance
- Performance Improvement Plan
- Administrative fines

Spending targets for "high-cost" hospitals are 1.8%, 1.7%, and 1.6% for 2026, 2027–2028, and 2029, respectively.
